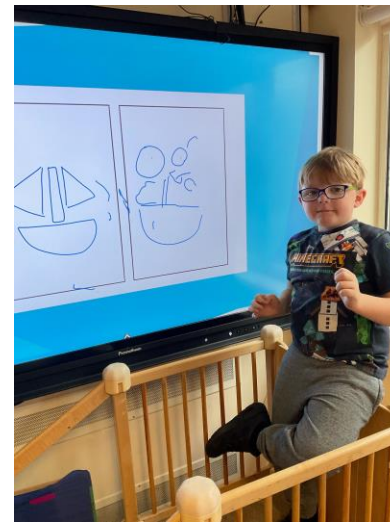

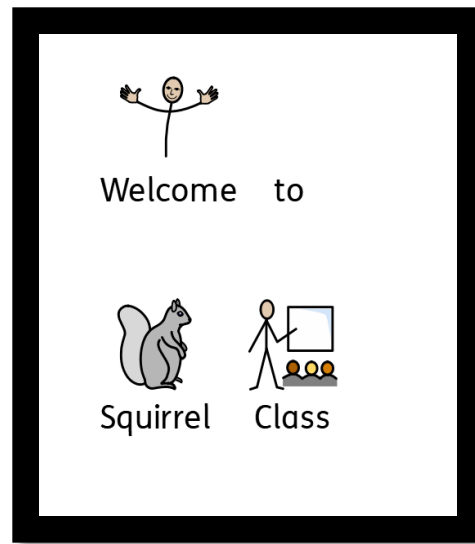

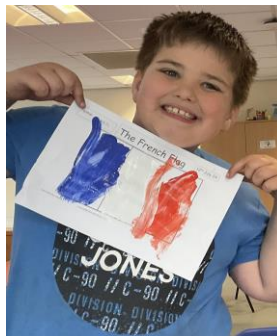
Woodpeckers

Learning and copying sequences of actions in class and in karate too; is always good fun.

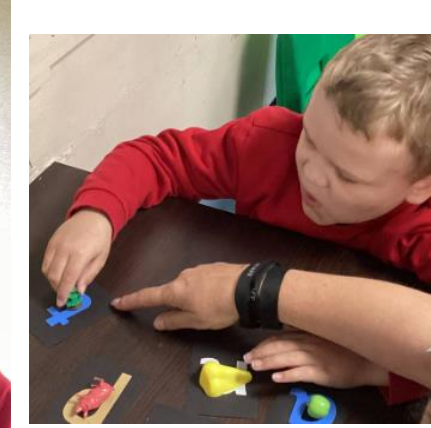
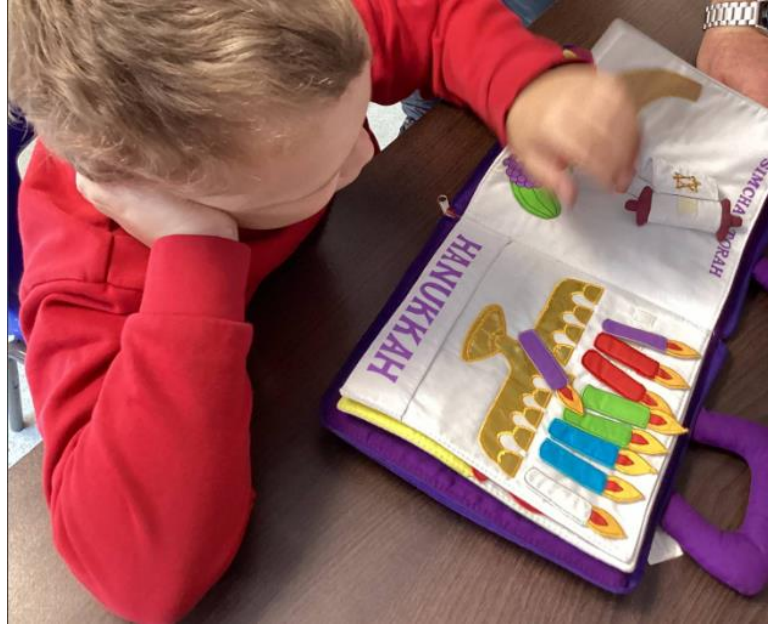
