After somebody dies, there is usually a funeral. A lot of people come together to remember the person who died.






Many people cry at a funeral. There are also a lot of hugs.




At the funeral, the body of the person who died will be in a special wooden box called a coffin. The coffin goes the front of the church and some friends and family may place things on the coffin.



After the funeral, the coffin will be closed and one of two things will happen, depending on what the person who died asked for. Sometimes, the coffin will be placed into a deep hole in the ground. Remember, the person who died cannot feel anything anymore. There will be a gravestone where the person is buried. Sometimes, the body will be taken to a special place where it will be turned into a kind of powder called ashes. The ashes will be kept in a pot called an urn.


