In Oct 2017 Halton Carers Centre received the shocking news that one of own team had received some terrible news about her own health, here is Lorina's story.....

'In Oct 2017 I got the news nobody wants to hear, I had Leukaemia, a form of blood cancer. What followed was a long 9 months in which I had 4 rounds of chemotherapy and long stays in hospital, thankfully I achieved complete remission and have remained that way since. During this time I had amazing support off my family, friends and colleagues here at the carers centre, however it was very difficult to adjust back to normal life after my treatment and everything I had been through.

As a support worker at the carers centre part of my role here is to advise people of what support is available to them and I decided it was time to receive support for myself. As well as being able to access the many services we offer here at the carers centre, another of the organisations I registered with was **Widnes & Runcorn Cancer Support Group**, I received a warm welcome and was able to talk to other people in my situation and receive holistic therapies.

In June of this year, for a small fee, myself and my family were able to access a respite break in the Widnes & Runcorn Cancer Support Group caravan in Talacre, North Wales, the caravan was beautiful with everything you could possibly need and was in a lovely quiet spot where I could sit on the balcony and enjoy the fresh sea air. The site has had a major refurbishment and there is lots to do for both young and old, there are also quieter areas of the park where you can access swimming, drinks etc if you prefer to be away from the main complex. If your as fortunate as we were with good weather the lovely beach is only a 5 minute walk away. We had a fabulous break, it was so lovely to spend time together as a family, in a nice environment, I felt so relaxed afterwards and it had really lifted my mood. It was just what we all needed after everything.'

A helping hand with your water bill

Don't suffer in silence - that's the message from United Utilities if you're struggling to pay your water bill.

"If you're going through a tough financial patch and are finding it hard to pay your water bill, please get in touch with us on **0800 072 6765**. We're easy to talk to and the sooner you call, the quicker we can get you the right support to prevent you falling further into debt," says Jane Haymes from United Utilities.

One scheme, called Payment Matching Plus, promises to make you debt free within two years. Jane adds "If you've built up a lot of debt, our Payment Matching Plus scheme will get you back on track. For every £1 you pay we'll put in £1 too and after six months we'll increase our contribution to £2. We'll then clear any remaining debt if you continue to make regular payments for two years."

If you're receiving Pension Credit and struggling to make payments you can apply to United Utilities for their Help to Pay scheme. This caps your bill at a reduced amount based on your Income and outgoings.



If you're struggling to make water bill payments due to losing your job or having to pay out for an unexpected emergency, the company's Payment Break scheme can help by delaying your payments for an agreed period. Any delayed payments are then spread over a longer period of time.

United Utilities can also help if you're applying for Universal Credit by delaying your water bill payments for up to eight weeks while you wait for your first UC payment to arrive. Jane also commented "If your home has more bedrooms than people, it's also worth considering a water meter as it's one of the easiest ways to make a big saving on your bill We fit them for free and you can even switch back to your old bill within two years if for whatever reason you're not making a saving."

If you are on a watermeter and using excess water due to a health condition of someone in the household you may be eligble for the Watersure scheme which can see your bills capped at £441.31 per annum, again a criteria does apply but this can be found on United Utilities website or by ringing the number below.

Have you entered our Carers Centre Lottery yet? Halton Carers Centre's Carers Lottery is an opportunity for you to help us raise money for carers and have a chance of winning a cash prize!

All money raised will help us to run the centre which currently supports provides services to over 5000 young & adult carers in Halton.

Can you spare 2 hours a week (term time) to join Halton SEND Parent Carer Forum?

The Parent carer forum is a group of parents and carers of disabled children aged 0 -25 years. Their aim is to make sure the services in their area meet the needs of disabled children and their families.

They do this by gathering the views of local families and then working in partnership with Halton Borough Council,

education settings, health providers and other providers to highlight where local services, processes and commissioners are working well, or challenge when changes or improvements need to be made. Forums usually have a steering group of parents who lead this work and listen to the views of other parents in the local area to make sure they know what is important to them.

Who can join a parent carer forum? Parents or carers of a child with any type of additional need or disability are welcome to join. Joining the forum does not mean you have to commit lots of time. In most forums you can join and receive information, and then decide if you want to get more involved at your own pace.

The forum represents the views of parents in the local area but does not advocate for individual families. Co-production is an important principle in parent carer participation. Co-production is when parent carer forums play an integral and equal part in the decision making process and are fully engaged in shaping, developing, implementing and evaluating services and systems. Forums are keen to hear from as many parent carers as possible.

Important Information for Carers About Flu Vaccinations. The following information is for people caring for a partner, relative, friend or neighbour who relies on them for help due to illness, disability, physical or mental ill health, frailty or an addiction. If you are the main carer of someone whose health would be at risk if you fell ill, or if you are in receipt of Carer's Allowance you are entitled to a free flu vaccination.

A flu vaccination:

- Will help you avoid getting flu.
- Help reduce the risk of you being too ill to look after the person you care for.
- Reduce the chance of you passing flu on to the person you care for.

If you have not already received your invite from your GP Practice for an annual flu jab, you can give them a call and let them know you are a carer and would like to have the flu jab.

The Brindley Theatre is currently running a Carer Theatre Seat Concession pilot in partnership with Halton Carers Center! During the period of 1st Aug 2019 - 31st July 2020 carers registered with Halton Carers Centre can apply for a

concession ticket . To be part of this scheme you need to contact Halton Carers Centres permission to share your name, home address, post code and unique *carers ID number (your id number on our d/base) The information that will be provided by the Halton Carers Centres to Halton Borough Council will not be shared with any third parties and will only be used for the purposes of this trial. The trial period for this offer ends on Wednesday 31st July 2020 at which time your details will no longer be held by the Brindley Theatre.

You can opt out of the Brindley Seat Concession at any time by notifying the Carers Centre on 01928 580 182 or emailing help@haltoncarers.co.uk.

What shows are included during the trial period?

Brindley Theatre promotional shows (promotional shows being events that are under the council's control) that take place within the trial period dates. The concession will not apply to shows from private Hirers of the Brindley Theatre. There will be up to a maximum of four Halton Registered Carer seats available per promotional show for Carers to occupy, subject to availability. All tickets at the Brindley Theatre are sold on a first come first served basis and we cannot guarantee seat availability. This offer cannot be applied to tickets that have already been purchased.

How can I book a Halton Registered Carers seat at the Brindley Theatre?

The individual must purchase their seat and that of their carer within the same transaction a minimum of 7 days prior to the performance. In person at the Box Office Monday to Friday 10am – 5pm. Where you will need to provide your unique Halton Registered Carers Identification number. By Telephone where, you will need to provide your unique Halton Registered Carers identification number*. Seats will not be available to book online during the trial. If you are wishing to book a ticket please contact Halton Carers Centre for your unique Halton Registered Carers Identification number*. All tickets will be held by the Box Office and only issued to the Carer and Cared for on the night of the performance. The Box Office is open 1 hour prior to the performance start time.

*Carers Identification number - each carer upon registering with the Carers Centre is given a unique id no for our database, if you wish to participate in the theatre seat concession trial please contact the centre for your Carers ID number.







Carers' Services



To book a therapy or podiatry appointment please contact either of our offices during our opening hours. Therapy appointments available include: Massages, facial, pedicures, manicures, waxing, tinting etc. Your first appointment will be free and for any following appointments with our beauty therapist there will be a small charge. Please request a current price list from our offices. For podiatry again your first appointment will be free and any following appointments will be £10 each.

Charges for missed appointments

We require 24 hours' notice for a cancellation so that we can reallocate the appointment. Otherwise, we will charge you for the cost of the appointment. This will be £25.00 for a chiropody appointment and £10 for a therapy appointment. Any carers who do not pay the charge will be unable to access any further treatments.
